The Interior Design Lecture Series serves as a foundational 1-year program for individuals who are interested in exploring a career in Interior Design. The program offers a mix of subjects ranging from conceptual and critical thinking courses to technical courses. The program is broken down into the Basic and Advanced modules.

Students work closely in small groups within an interactive and cooperative classroom environment. The ID Lecture Series will also offer the basics of the profession through "Design Studio 1". Students are offered various enriching opportunities ranging from internships in the industry, interacting with interior design icons, and study trips that expose students to new technologies, research and innovation in the profession inside and outside the country.

Students have the option to begin with the Basic or Advanced course depending on their background. The basic module is an introductory course that helps enthusiasts learn about the techniques, theories, and trends of Interior Design. This program caters both to existing students and to individuals who may be considering further study. Practical projects will promote an understanding of the discipline and the importance of our idea-based design process. Through the advanced module, students learn about aesthetics, the materials and resources to use, and hands-on procedures. The aim will be to create a foundation in design and technical drawing skills, as well as 3-dimensional thinking and space analysis. These skills will help them confront any design issue.

- Character Reference Letter (for college graduates)

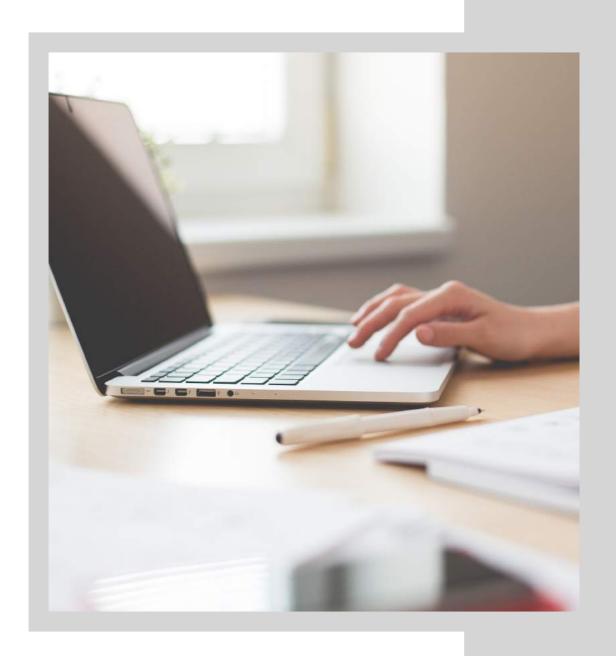

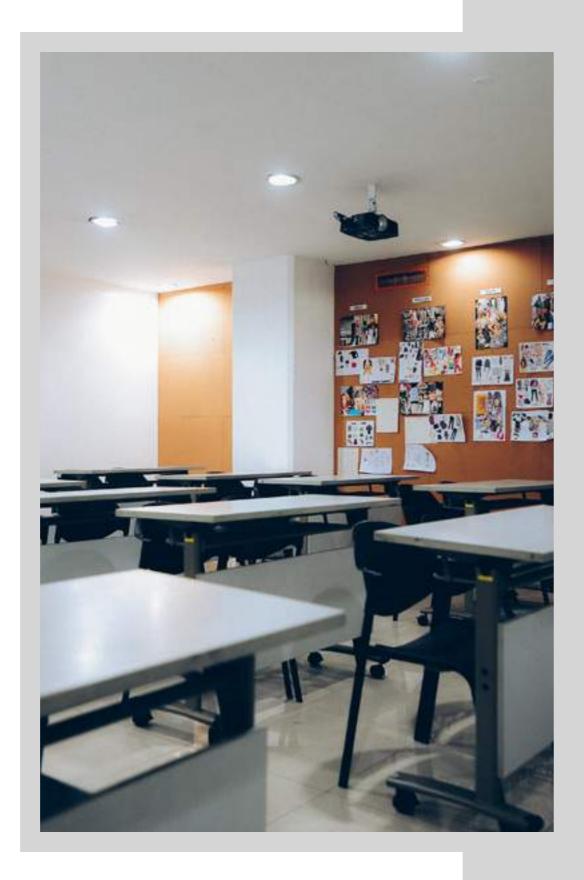

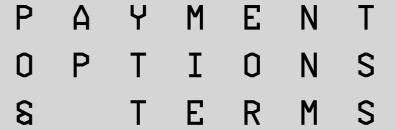

In part of our efforts to curb the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic, we encourage anyone who wishes to conduct payment transactions with the institute to settle instead via online or remote banking means.

PAYMENT OPTIONS STERMS

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

- 1. Upon enrollment, the student must settle initial dues based on the chosen mode of payment by the last day of the regular enrollment period
- 2. The student will still be allowed to enroll after the regular enrollment period until the second week of the semester. However, transactions made within the said timeline will be considered as late enrollment. A late fee of PHP1,500 will be charged for the first week, PHP3,000 for the second week, Php 4,5000 for the third week, and Php 6,000 for the fourth week.
- 3. It is in the school's policy that a minimum number of students must be enrolled in a class for it to proceed. In the case of class dissolution or change in class schedule, the following are the student's options:
  - a. Transfer the student's enrollment to a different class. Should the student opt for this, he/. she must advise the Admissions Office through e-mail (admissions@sofa.edu.ph), and fill out the Transfer of Credit Request Form which may be obtained at the Admissions Office. If the student chooses to enroll in a class with higher tuition than what he/she originally paid, the student must settle the difference. Likewise, if the student chooses to enroll in a class with lesser tuition, then the school will refund the overpaid amount.
  - b. Merge with another class section, if possible.
  - c. Request for a full refund (for Certificate and Short Courses only). Should the student opt for this, he/she must accomplish the Enrollment Adjustment Form (ENAF) which may be obtained at the Admissions Office. The student must advise the Admissions Office of the decision to refund through e-mail (admissions@sofa.edu.ph).

#### **REFUND POLICY**

- a. Application for refunds take up to thirty (30) working days for processing.
- b. Tuition for credit programs shall be refunded 90% if dropped prior to the start of the semester, 75% shall be refunded for an approved dropping request made during the first week and 50 % for an approved dropping request during the second week.
- c. All refunds shall be issued in the form of a check which shall be made payable to the applicant's full name on record.
- d. Tuition for workshops shall be refunded 90% if dropped prior to the start of the class, non-refundable once classes have commenced, regardless if the student attends or not.
- e. All miscellaneous fees are non-refundable.
- 4. For students who choose to settle tuition through installment terms, he/she must pay the remaining balance in the dates stated in the Tuition and Miscellaneous Fees document. A late fee of PHP500 will be charged per week.
- 5. For students who choose to settle tuition via check, a penalty of 10% of the check amount will be charged if check is returned by the bank.
